My research pushes the edges of the field and paves the way for contemporary relevancy in both formal and community-based educational environments, focusing specifically on enhancing human emotional, cultural and cognitive capacities. To date I have published 33 peer reviewed journal articles nationally and internationally. I have been associated with \$5,168,010 in grants, including \$2,330,105 self-directed. Full research papers have been published in 14 conference proceedings both nationally and internationally. Moreover, I have over 80 research presentations and 26 research posters presented at both domestic and international conferences, many with graduate and undergraduate students as presenters and authors.
